ALWAYS WITH OPPORTUNITY

The positive part of our experience over the past 18 months has been the pace and the latitude. While often unbearably rigorous, other times, the pace became quiet and reflective. It was those quiet times that allowed us the latitude to reinvent and try new things. We were able to drill down deep and evaluate our mission and organization for ways to re-envision.

COVID forced us to adjust our approach and adapt in ways that have allowed us to reboot, root-out things that weren't working well and start fresh with a programming platform that combined all the best of what we were before COVID with all the great things we discovered during our COVID operations.

While the structure of the OK Programs platform continues to evolve and refine, it is in a place that feels close to complete. We are now in the late phases of staffing the program, acquiring the technology to properly enhance the program and developing the partnerships that will help us embed the program in the community.

While we stay on the path with OK Programs, we are also working through some other important transitions. We have wished some of our long-time staff a farewell this year, accepting 9 resignations. In transition, we've found opportunities to promote current staff members and hire new ones. As our staffing plans progress, we are also refocused on numerous other exciting opportunities.

III ENTERPRISE OPS

With the loss of a key leader in the culinary arm of our Knockout Enterprise, we find ourselves in a position to re-tool and address not only that vacancy, but the other opportunities for human energy that are required to take the enterprise forward. We are working through the mechanics of this process and targeting early 2022 to staff back up and get back in full Knockout activity.

INDEPENDENT LIVING

COVID slowed our pace to a crawl with this initiative, but we have made progress in our efforts to launch residential support services. We have developed our philosophy. We have begun the provider enrollment process with the State of Illinois. We completed an in-depth survey with families, gauging their vision and readiness to transition. While the application process continues, we are taking those survey results back to committee and recalibrating our efforts in 2022.

MISSION STRATEGY

One of our key objectives at this moment is to commit to a revision of our strategic plan. We are very much in need of this exercise to account for what we've become since the last revision. Much clarity has come from the COVID transitions. We recognize that now is a ripe time to dedicate ourselves to mapping and articulating our re-envisioned mission.



From posting pics of her walks on our Warrior-blog platform to attending on-site programs via Zoom and then finally returning to in-person programming, Ryan has never stopped adapting, participating, and growing!

He made friends easily, but was usually modest when sharing thoughts and joining in on conversations. As pandemic programming progressed, we produced a virtual programming platform.

ADAPTABLE FUNDRAISERS

The development plan was wiped clean in March of 2020. When COVID hit, our event plans were ruined. As an organization that still relied on event fundraising for nearly 40% of the overall operating budget, we were forced to reinvent ourselves in order to sustain ourselves.



RE-ENVISIONED EVENTS In the past 20 months, we have been agile, inventive, and highly successful in our approach to re-envisioned events. We rallied quickly in 2020 when our gala was canceled 2 weeks prior to the event, turning it into our most successful event in the organization's history.

We then proceeded to rewrite the playbooks and create 3 all-new virtual events in the Warrior-thon, Friday Night Bites, and the Virtual Gala. We also re-introduced a very successful golf outing. We are grateful for the community that supports us, as this success wouldn't be imaginable without the donors, sponsors, and partners that came together to keep the mission going.

PAYROLL PROTECTION PROGRAM We are proud to say that at no time over the course of the past 20 months did we cut staff or benefits. We are also very happy and grateful to have had the opportunity to lean into the SBA's PPP to help us keep the promises we made to our team that we would sustain together.




